Listening to the Ministry Introduction

Scripture Reading: Gal. 3:2, 5, 20, 9, 14; Rom. 8:2, 6, 10-11, 30; 10:17

- I. To receive the Spirit by faith is God's revealed way; it is in the light of God's revelation and issues in life and glory; hence, we must treasure faith, not the works of law; it is by the hearing of faith that we have received the Spirit that we may participate in God's promised blessing and live Christ—8:2, 6, 10-11, 30:
 - A. God's New Testament economy is a matter of supplying the Spirit and receiving the Spirit; on God's side, He supplies the Spirit; on our side, we receive the Spirit; the supplying of the Spirit and the receiving of the Spirit do not take place once for all; on the contrary, they are continual—Gal. 3:5; John 3:34; 7:38.
 - B. Both the supplying of the Spirit and the receiving of the Spirit are by the hearing of faith, not by the works of law—Gal. 3:2, 5.
- II. We all should declare that we are hearing Christians, not working Christians; to hear is a great blessing; we come together for the hearing of faith; by this hearing we receive the supply of the Spirit—1 Tim. 1:4; Gal. 3:5.
- III.As we hear about those things in which we are to believe, faith is produced within us; the more we hear about these good things, the more we appreciate them; spontaneously this appreciation issues in our believing in those very things about which we have heard—Rom. 10:17:
 - A. People hear of God's grace; then they appreciate it and call upon the Lord; they go on to receive, accept, join, partake of, and enjoy this grace, which is the Triune God processed to be everything to us; this is faith—John 3:16; 1:12; Rom. 10:9, 13.
 - B. In His New Testament economy God intends to make us hearers of faith; this faith is the reflection of the Triune God processed to become our all-inclusive grace; God desires that we become those who continually hear the faith; through this enjoyment we become one with Him; we become a universal and eternal entity to express His marvelous divinity—Gal. 3:14.

Listening to the Ministry Exercise Handout

I. Enabling audio reading through Google Play books app on Android devices:

- A. If you haven't already, turn on TalkBack.
- B. Open Play Books Play Books.
 - 1. If you already have the book, find it in the "Library" or "Home" screens.
 - 2. If you don't have the book, search for it at the top of the "Home" screen, then pick a result and download the book.
- C. Open the book.
- D. Tap the screen, then double-tap to enter skim mode.
- E. Select More and then Read aloud.
 - 1. To move through the text on a page, swipe.
 - 2. To flip pages, two-finger swipe left or right.

- II. **How to Enable Speak Screen** (TTS; works only on devices running iOS 8 and newer):
 - A. Open the Settings App.
 - B. Select the General tab then Accessibility > Speech > toggle Speak Screen on. (Note: The settings page here also allows for changing voices, adjusting speaking speed, and enabling highlighting.)
 - C. Open ebook reader application of your choice (iBooks, Google Play books, etc.).
 - D. Activate Speak Screen by swiping down from the top of the screen with two fingers.
 - E. The Speak Screen onscreen menu allows for pause, play, go back, go forward, and change rate of speech; the menu can be minimized by tapping the arrow.
